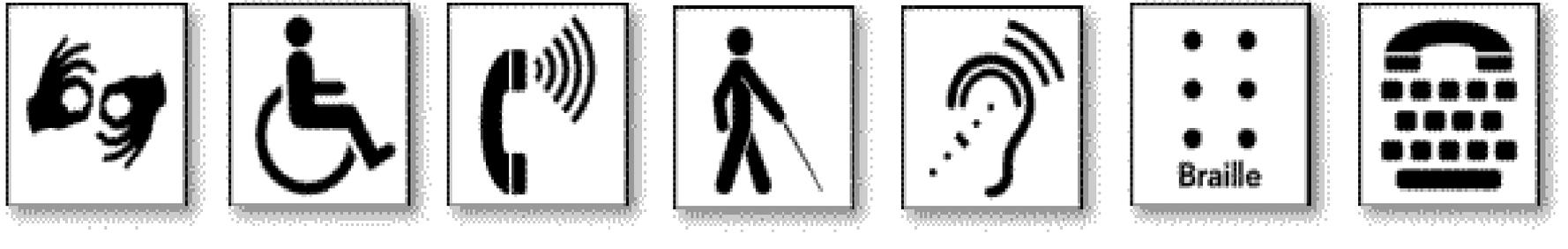

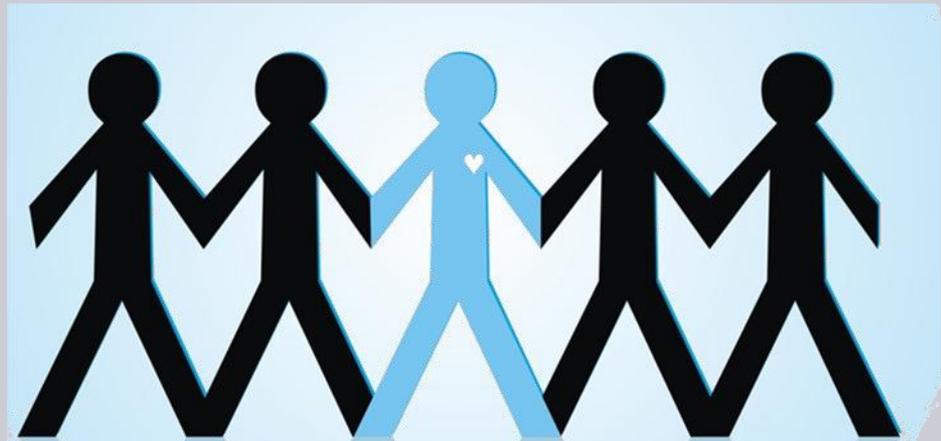

Identifying People

- Common belief in “Volunteer Registries”
 - Perceived promise or guarantee that the registrants will be provided with evacuation services
 - Planning is based on an individual always being at home
 - Tendency to view those on the registry as the only ones who need assistance
 - Focus on registrants first, rather than looking at the population more broadly
 - Unrealistic expectations of first-responders

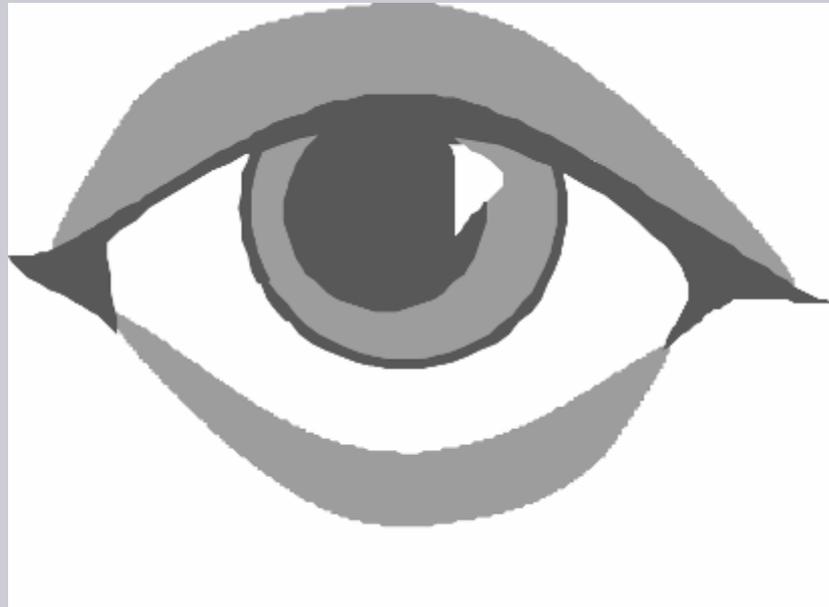

Accessible Communications



Early-Warning Notification Systems

- Ability to send text messages to wireless devices (in multiple languages).
- Ability to send messages to TTY's, Pagers, Video Relays, etc.
- System which is frequently tested

Emergency Alert Systems

- Accessible Messaging
 - Captioned?
 - Reading of scrolled messages?
 - Is the information provided, easy to understand (not higher than 3rd Grade Reading Level)?
 - Messages are tested with end users (children, cognitive disabilities, LEP)

Press Conferences

- Sign-language interpreting provided?
- Television broadcasts include interpreter on the screen?
- Real-time captioning provided?

- **Targeting Community Care Facilities:**
All community living, assisted living & residential facilities must be identified in advance & plans for evacuation of persons with disabilities & older adults must be in place. This includes, but is not limited to: evacuation of facilities housing people with mental illnesses, developmental disabilities & older adults.

Technology

- **Is so woven into our daily routine that it is almost invisible & taken for granted.**
- **But without it, PAS needs may increase, when technology is left behind, lost or damaged.**

- **Transport Agreements:** Develop local agreements between transit, Paratransit & private services to provide assistance with personnel & vehicles during an emergency. Agreements should include the provision for cost recovery for services given during a federally declared event. The agreement should also outline method(s) for communication between service providers & the evacuees.

Sheltering

This we know to be true....

- People with access & functional needs have the right to be at general population shelters
- Government has responsibility for sheltering
- Local government is the first level of response
- CA Dept. of Social Services has the lead for sheltering at the state level

Key Concepts about the Sheltering of People with Access & Functional Needs

- Can be accommodated in general population shelters with support.
- Planning and coordination is needed to meet Access & Functional Needs
- Support for sheltering People with Access and Functional Needs: Government, Non – Government Organizations (NGOs) and private sources.



FAST Description & Duties

- Government and non- government employees can be volunteers.
- Deployed by the Care and Shelter Branch Coordinator - ICS/NIMS resource.
- Can be moved between shelters and/or Local Assistance Centers (LACs).
- Knowledge of local service networks – helpful in obtaining resources.

FAST Qualifications

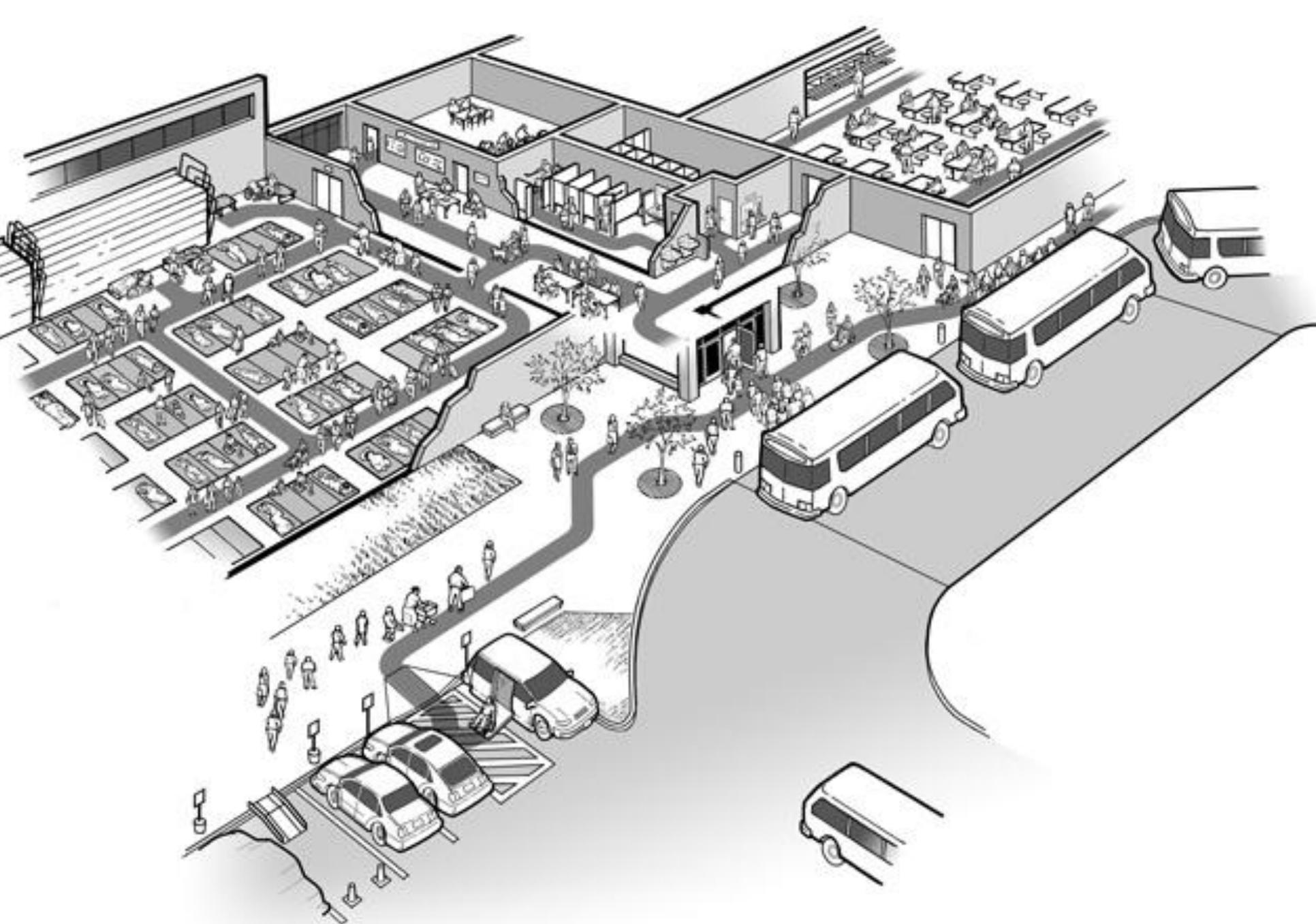
- 2 years experience working with populations

- Ability to work under difficult & stressful situations

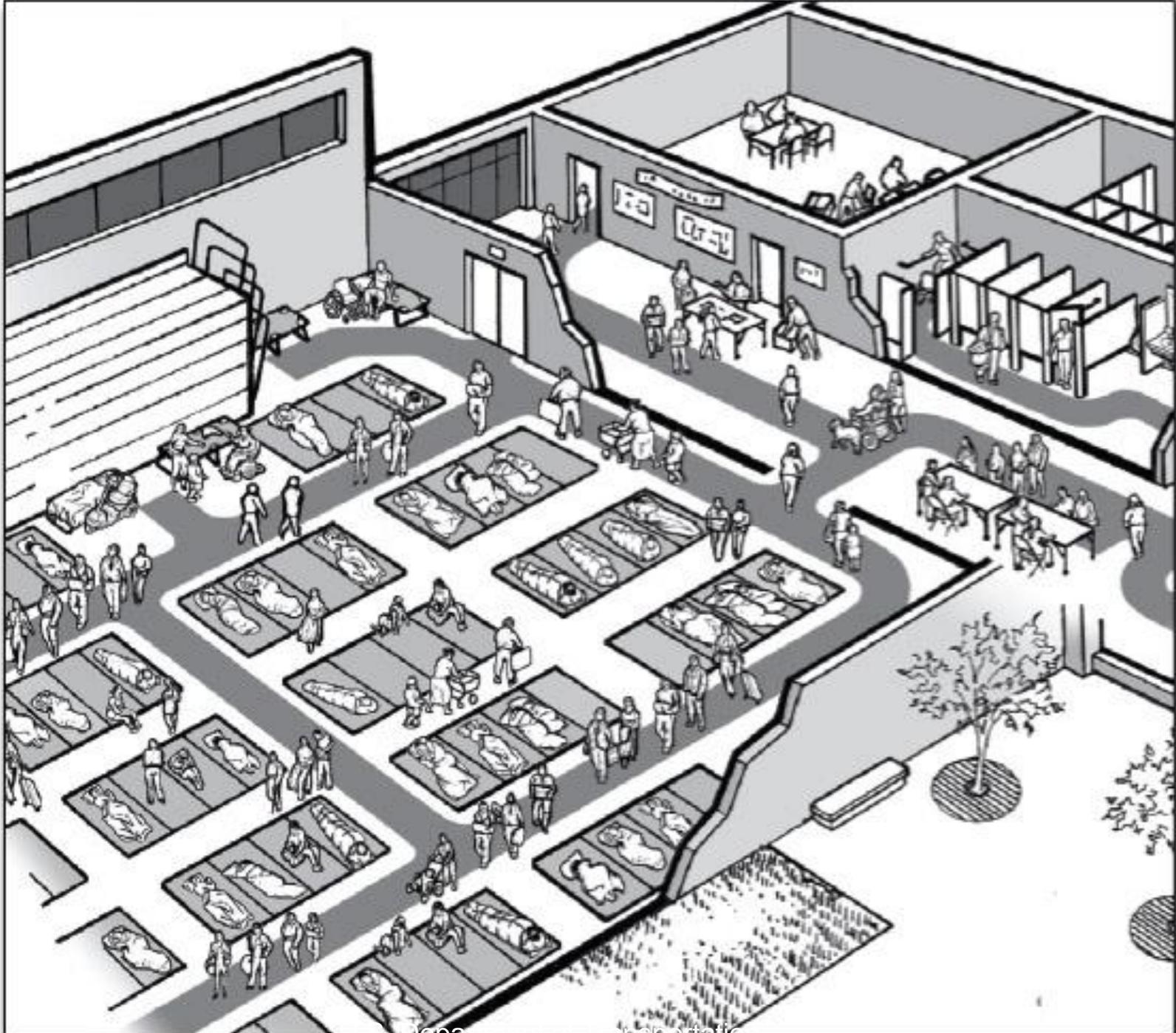

Transitioning Back to the Community

Client Referral Patterns

Access & Functional Needs or other positions with the authority, responsibility & resources to:

- Lead in coordinating recovery workgroup consisting of government, business & nonprofit organizations.**



- **Service coordination & case management**
- **Transportation**
- **Housing (temporary & permanent)**
- **Acquiring necessities, i.e. clothing & household supplies**
- **Health & Mental Health services**



- Descriptions of services should be disseminated using multiple communication arteries (radio, TV, internet, fact sheets, posters, etc.) -- It is required that all materials and forms be available in alternate formats that should include:
 - Large print (no less than 14-point)
 - Braille
 - CD
 - Electronic
 - Audio

- There should be consideration to making recovery services mobile by going to places of residents and community-based organizations.
- When applications need to be completed on-site, procedures should be in place to provide assistance to individuals with Access and Functional Needs. The type of assistance could include the reading of materials and the filling out forms.

- **Re-establish or access public benefits & services.**
- **Replacing DME and technology.**
- **Identifying temporary & permanent independent living options.**
- **Repairing or rebuilding damaged access housing elements such as ramps, accessible bathroom elements, etc.**
