The Latest Numbers

- 1,517,097 people ages 18 and up (95%) got at least one dose of vaccine and 1,222,230 people ages 18 and up (80.7%) are fully vaccinated in Philadelphia, as of February 22nd, 2022.
 - 90.5% of people ages 12 and up and 53.6% of children 5 11 years old have received at least one dose of the Pfizer vaccine.
- 389,324 people ages 18 and up (34.1%) have received boosters since August 13, 2021.

Latest COVID Vaccine News

- Congratulations Philly!
 - 1 million people are fully vaccinated and protected from COVID-19.
 - 3 million doses of COVID-19 vaccine have been given in the city of Philadelphia.
 - We are getting there, but more people need to be fully vaccinated and get a booster dose for us all to stay safe and help move us out of the pandemic.
- Eligible residents can get \$100 for getting fully vaccinated.
 - Residents are eligible at the time they receive a single dose of J&J or a second dose of Pfizer or Moderna.
 - Go to one of the participating PDPH COVID-19 vaccine clinics and sign up to receive your incentive by email within 1-2 days or by mail within 10 14 days.

New COVID-19 Response Levels

- The new COVID Response Levels tie the City's COVID mandates to specific data and numbers.
- These levels were created to:
 - Increase transparency around the decision-making process for COVID guidance and mandates, and allow residents to set expectations.
 - Allow us to be flexible and increase restrictions if there is another variant or increase in cases.
- There are four COVID-19 response levels.
 - Each level is connected to how the City's public mandates will be enforced.
- We are currently in Level 2: Mask Precautions.
 - The current response level will be closely monitored and updated as needed every <u>Monday</u>.

Immigrant and Refugee Wellness Academy Now Accepting Applications

- Immigrant/Refugee Wellness Academy (IRWA) is a free training program.
- IRWA is designed to empower and prepare Philadelphia's multilingual/multicultural immigrants and
 refugees with knowledge, resources, and tools necessary to engage in activities that address behavioral
 health and intellectual disability challenges, trauma, and inequity experienced within the immigrant and
 refugee community.
- The benefits of this certificate program include behavioral health and intellectual disability knowledge and understanding, mental health interpretation skills, leadership and advocacy skills, and more.

COVID-19 Vaccine Information

- Where to find a COVID-19 vaccine:
 - Call 3-1-1 or visit <u>phila.gov/vaccine</u> or <u>vaccines.gov</u> to find a vaccine clinic near you.
 - For interpretation, call 3-1-1, press #5 and say your language.
 - Vaccine is free, no insurance or ID required!
- Where to find a COVID-19 test:
 - Visit www.COVIDtests.gov to order your free at-home rapid COVID-19 test kits.
 - Call 3-1-1 or visit phila.gov/testing to find a site near you (available in 6 languages).
 - Testing is FREE at most sites in Philadelphia.

- Lost Vaccination Card?
 - Ask your healthcare provider first, if they cannot help, call 215-685-5488 or email covid@phila.gov to request a copy of your vaccine record.
 - The CDC does not provide copies of COVID-19 vaccination card.

 - Send us an email at COVIDVax@phila.gov with a file of your event flyer at least two weeks in advance and we will advertise your event on our social media!

FAQ on the COVID-19 INCENTIVE PROGRAM

- What is the COVID-19 Vaccine Incentive Program?
 - Eligible residents can sign up to get \$100 for getting fully vaccinated.
 - Residents are eligible at the time they receive a single dose of J&J or a second dose of Pfizer or Moderna.

 - You will not receive \$100 the day you get vaccinated and there are not cash or cards on site.
- Who is eligible to receive this incentive?
 - Receiving your first dose of J&J
 - Receiving your second dose of Pfizer or Moderna
 - *Please bring proof of your 1st vaccine or, if you were vaccinated in Philly, we can look up your vaccine record.
- Who is not eligible at this time?
 - Receiving your first dose of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine.
 - Receiving a booster dose of Pfizer, Moderna, or J&J.
 - You are under 18 and do not have a parent or guardian present.
 - You are not a resident of Philadelphia.
 - *A piece of mail with your name and Philadelphia address is fine.
 - You are a City employee.
- Children ages 11 and older can consent for vaccine by themselves; can they get the incentive?
 - Yes, children ages 5 17 can receive this incentive, but a parent or guardian must be present to consent to the incentive.
- Can I get an incentive anywhere vaccine is offered in Philadelphia?
 - Unfortunately, funds are limited. Incentives are only offered at the sites on the back of this page and at http://bit.ly/fullyvaccinatedincentive
- Why is PDPH offering money for people to get vaccinated now and why is the incentive not offered for people getting a first dose of a 2-dose vaccine?
 - Many Philadelphians have already received their first dose. For many reasons, not everyone has been fully vaccinated.



- In Philadelphia, people who are not fully vaccinated are still at high-risk of getting sick with COVID-19, being hospitalized with COVID-19, or passing the virus to others.
- We want to encourage people to take the next step and get fully vaccinated.
- Why are you offering J&J when there are some safety concerns about this vaccine?
 - J&J provides adequate protection against COVID-19. It is being offered for those who are unwilling or unable to get vaccinated with a two-dose vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna).
- What about all the people who are already fully vaccinated; will they also get \$100?
 - At this point in the pandemic, the best way to protect everyone in our community and get closer to the pandemic being over is for more people to become fully vaccinated.
 - That is why the incentive is only available to people receiving their only dose of J&J or second dose
 of Pfizer or Moderna.
