

COVID-19 and Seasonal Flu

November 2022

The flu and COVID-19 are respiratory viruses that affect your lungs and breathing. Protect yourself and your loved ones by getting both the flu vaccine and COVID-19 booster.

- The flu (influenza) vaccine is updated every year to protect against the strains (types) of the flu that are expected to be the most common or dangerous.
- COVID-19 booster doses are developed to protect against new strains (types) of COVID-19 that are the most contagious.
- It's important to get your flu vaccine every year and to get a COVID-19 booster, each time its offered.

Both COVID-19 and the flu spread from person to person in similar ways and cause similar symptoms, but they are caused by different viruses.









COVID-19 and the flu can be spread by:

- Droplets (smaller particles) may stay in the air when someone with COVID-19 or the flu breathes, sneezes, or coughs, allowing the virus to infect another person.
- Touching an object or surface with viruses on it then touching your mouth, nose, or eyes.
- Did you know? People infected with COVID-19 or the flu may not feel any symptoms and can spread the viruses to others before they even feel sick.

Prevent the spread of COVID-19 and the flu:

- Wear a mask inside crowded public spaces
- Wash your hands often
- Avoid touching your face
- Cough and sneeze into the back of your elbow or a tissue
