

Philadelphia Department of Public Health (PDPH) WEEKLY MPOX UPDATE

LATEST NUMBERS

- As of November 30, 2022:
 - 546 total Mpox cases (confirmed + presumed)
 - Information on criteria for presumed cases available here.
 - 7,023 doses and 3,274 second doses have been administered.
 - Information on the federal management of Monkeypox vaccine delivery available here.
- Data on Mpox cases and vaccine distribution, with demographic characteristics, are updated here.
 - The Health Department, as part of its goal to be as transparent as possible, is one of the first
 jurisdictions in the country to report demographics on both people who have monkeypox and
 vaccine recipients.

Bring the Monkeypox Vaccine to You

- If you have an event coming up, PDPH can host an information table and sign eligible people up for Monkeypox vaccine appointments.

• Expanded Vaccine Eligibility: Anyone at risk can now get a Monkeypox vaccine

- On November 4, 2022, PDPH issued a health update stating any patient who feels they are at risk for coming into contact with Monkeypox can now be vaccinated.
 - They do not need to meet any further eligibility criteria.

- The call center will ask questions to determine risk of exposure and eligibility to be vaccinated.
- The call center can make appointments for eligible residents to get a Monkeypox vaccine and provide guidance on quarantine, isolation, and safety following exposure.

LATEST ADVOCACY EFFORTS FOR AN EQUITABLE RESPONSE

• Local partners able to expand the Monkeypox Response

- More than half of those diagnosed with monkeypox have reported their race as Black, while only 27% of vaccine doses have been administered to Black Philadelphians.
- PDPH has awarded funding to 8 local partners.
 - Build an equitable and accessible monkeypox vaccination network across the city of Philadelphia that serves people who are at high risk for infection, particularly persons in under-vaccinated demographic groups.
 - Create vaccine access points in geographic areas and for communities that are at high risk for monkeypox from under-vaccinated demographic groups.
 - Direct monkeypox vaccination outreach to Philadelphia residents who are at high risk for monkeypox but may be harder to reach.

- To decrease barriers to vaccine access, PDPH has:
 - Expanded vaccine eligibility to include anyone who thinks they are at risk.
 - Opened walked up clinics. See the attached flyer for more details.
 - Publicly promoted vaccine being available at select Rite Aid pharmacy locations.
- PDPH is attending relevant in-person and virtual events to offer current information.
 - If you are interested in PDPH attending your event, please email us at publichealthpreparedness@phila.gov to discuss.
- PDPH meets monthly with the community advisory group. The meeting is to hear concerns, ask
 questions and collaborate with community members and leaders to respond to the outbreak.
 - The Health Department is working to build relationships with organizations and businesses that serve persons at high-risk for monkeypox, that would like to collaborate with PDPH to host vaccination clinics and/or expand outreach efforts.
