

Philadelphia Department of Public Health (PDPH) WEEKLY MPOX UPDATE

LATEST NUMBERS

- As of April 5, 2023:
 - 552 total Mpox cases (confirmed + presumed)
 - 7,564 doses and 3,996 second doses have been administered.
- Data on Mpox cases and vaccine distribution, with demographic characteristics, are updated here, every 2 weeks on Wednesday.
 - The Health Department, as part of its goal to be as transparent as possible, is one of the first
 jurisdictions in the country to report demographics on both people who have monkeypox and
 vaccine recipients.

LATEST NEWS

- Mpox vaccine available for pride event organizers.
 - Partners who would like to offer mpox vaccine at Pride events can contact the Philadelphia Department of Public Health to be matched with a provider.
 - Email us at <u>publichealthpreparedness@phila.gov</u>
- The CDC states mpox cases decline, but many at risk did not complete their vaccine series.
 - Although the daily average for Mpox cases in March of this year was at 1 case per day (down from a peak of 400), vaccination for persons at risk for mpox is still recommended.
 - Despite administration of around 1 million vaccine doses, <u>only 23% of those who received their first doses</u> have received a second to complete the series.

- Anyone at risk can get an mpox vaccine
 - On November 4, 2022, PDPH issued a <u>health update</u> stating any patient who feels they are at risk for coming into contact with mpox can now be vaccinated.
 - They do not need to meet any further eligibility criteria.

- The Ballroom Outreach Working Group continues to meet.
- Health Department renames its Mpox Community Advisory Group (CAG) to the LGBTQ CAG.
 - In response to the mpox outbreak, PDPH formed a LGBTQ Community Advisory Group consisting of community stakeholders and leaders.
 - Their inputs were invaluable as the health department strategized and responded to contain the mpox outbreak. There was strong interest on both the part of the CAG and PDPH leadership to continue the CAG to inform programs and interventions addressing LGBTQ community health disparities and barriers to equitable, inclusive healthcare.
 - The group will meet quarterly, with next scheduled meeting on April 19.
