The Latest News

- Order free COVID tests!
 - Starting Monday, September 25 the federal government will re-open its free COVID-19 test kit program.
 - 4 free test kits per household.
 - Stock up now so you have tests available if you need them.
 - Kits will be available to order from: https://www.covid.gov/tests
- Updated COVID Vaccines
 - Many people across the United States are finding it hard to find their COVID vaccine, especially pediatric
 doses.
 - Since the federal government approved the new COVID vaccine on September 12, pharmacies, doctor's offices, and clinics have been ordering it. However, with so many places looking to get the vaccine it's been rather slow in coming.
 - PDPH recommends everyone 6 months and older get vaccinated.
 - As vaccine supply makes its way to Philadelphia, PDPH recommends:
 - Call ahead to make sure your vaccine provider has a vaccine for you.
 - Parents should also consider waiting until the end of September before seeking out a pediatric dose of COVID vaccine to make sure that it's available.
 - Confirm that your insurance considers your vaccine provider "in network." Insurance providers are now able to charge for "out of network" vaccinations.

- COVID Test Recall
 - The Philadelphia Department of Public Health is notifying residents who received what they believe to be Flowflex COVID-19 Antigen Home Tests to check the lot numbers on those tests.
 - If the lot number shown is COV2110012, they should throw the tests away.
 - Replacement tests are available from any of the five Health Department Resource Hubs: https://bit.ly/ResourceHubsPHL
 - The Health Department is doing the following in response to this recall:
 - Conducting a full inventory check of all COVID-19 tests in stock to ensure that they are valid.
 - Developing new procedures to confirm lot numbers and expiration date prior to shipment from our vendor.
 - Working with the vendor to replace all invalid tests.
 - The Health Department has also notified other health departments across the country to be aware of this problem and to check their stores.
