

## **COVID-19 and Seasonal Flu**

The flu and COVID-19 are diseases caused by viruses that most often cause respiratory symptoms like cough and stuffy nose but may also cause fatigue, fever and body aches. Protect yourself and your loved ones by getting your yearly flu vaccine and the updated 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccine.

- The flu shot is updated every year to protect against the types of the flu that are predicted to be the most common.
- The updated COVID-19 vaccine was created to protect against the most recent types/ variants of the virus.
- It's important to get your flu vaccine every year and your COVID-19 vaccine, each time it is recommended.

Both COVID-19 and the flu spread in similar ways and cause similar symptoms. It may be hard to know which virus you have.









- Droplets (smaller particles) may stay in the air when someone with COVID-19 or the flu breathes, sneezes, or coughs, allowing the virus to infect another person.
- Touching an object or surface with viruses on it then touching your mouth, nose, or eyes.
- Did you know? People infected with COVID-19 or the flu may not feel any symptoms and can spread the viruses to others before they even feel sick.

### Prevent the spread of COVID-19 and the flu:

- Wear a mask in crowded indoor spaces or around people who are at risk for severe disease.
- Wash your hands.
- Stay home if you are sick.
