

Becoming a Closed POD (Pills Only)

A Closed Point-of-Dispensing (POD) is a private site designated to handout life-saving medical countermeasures (MCMs) to a specific population during a public health emergency. As a Closed POD, an organization develops and coordinates a plan to receive and dispense MCMs to their staff, residents, and their families during an emergency. As a pills only POD, medically licensed staff are not required to be on-site for dispensing.

1. Decide to participate in the Closed POD program.

- Your organization should coordinate with administrators and emergency coordinators to determine if becoming a Closed POD would be beneficial for your organization.
- 2. Contact PDPH Closed POD program coordinators at <u>ClosedPOD@phila.gov</u> to express interest in becoming a Closed POD.
 - A PDPH representative will respond to your email request with more information about the Closed POD program and next steps.
- 3. Provide contact information for agency points-of-contact and organization information.
 - Points-of-contact should be emergency coordinators and organizational decision-makers.
 - Contact information should include emails and phone numbers.
 - Points-of-contact will be enrolled in PDPH's Everbridge mass notification system.

4. Assess organizational capacity.

- Closed POD should identify the following as part of their POD planning:
 - o Determine optimal spaces to operate a Closed POD.
 - o Determine which employees will be available to staff the POD.
 - Determine the communication methods to contact Closed POD staff and Closed POD populations for dispensing.
 - O Determine any legal and logistics concerns that should be reviewed by your agency's legal and/or HR departments.
- Identify your agency's populations who will receive MCM during a Closed POD.
 - Estimate the number of individuals who will receive MCM at your Closed POD, including:
 - Staff and employees
 - Patients, residents, and/or guests
 - Contractors or vendors
 - Household members of staff and employees
- 5. Develop Closed POD Plan.
- 6. Participate in trainings and exercises.
 - PDPH will conduct a Closed POD notification drill each year.
 - Points-of-contact are expected to respond to a simulated activation message.



• Periodically, PDPH will conduct a full-scale Closed POD exercise in which Closed POD partners will be expected to prepare their staff and facility to operate a full execution of their Closed POD Plan.
