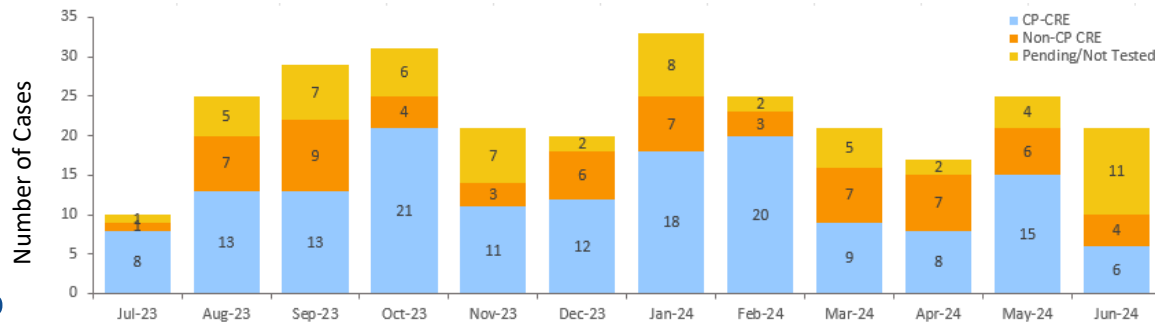
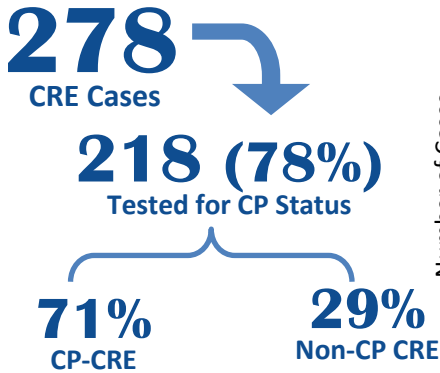

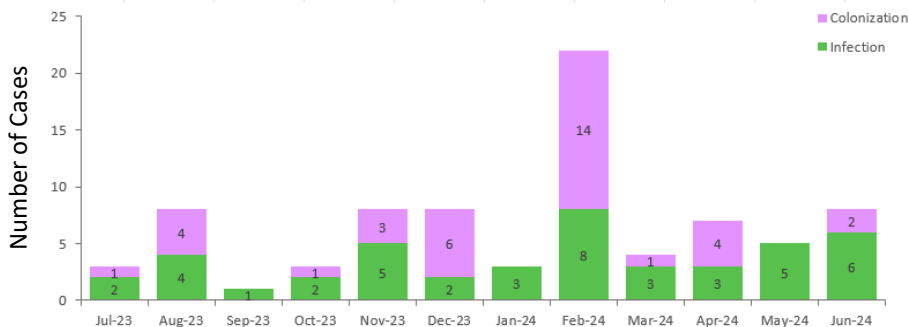
CRE Cases, by Carbapenemase-Producing (CP) Status: July 2023—June 2024

Candida auris continues to be an emerging threat in the southeastern PA and Philadelphia regions. The first *C. auris* case in PA was reported in March 2020 and since then, cases of both infection and colonization continue to rise. The majority of colonization cases appear in local healthcare facility clusters.
