### Latest News on Measles in Philadelphia

- The Health Department announced today, Friday, April 11, 2025, that people who were at the following sites on the days listed may have been exposed to measles.
  - o Pennsylvania Hospital Emergency Department
    - 800 Spruce Street, Philadelphia, PA 19107
      - Sunday, April 6, 2025, between 3:55pm and 11:20pm
  - o Holy Redeemer Hospital Emergency Department
    - 1648 Huntingdon Pike, Meadowbrook, PA 19046
      - Tuesday, April 8, 2025, between 6:05pm and 9:45pm
- If you were at any of the sites on the days listed, call your healthcare provider to see if you're immune to measles and watch for symptoms.
- This measles case was exposed while traveling abroad and is not connected with the outbreak in the western states.

#### WHAT TO DO IF YOU HAVE BEEN EXPOSED TO MEASLES

#### Check if you are protected against measles.

- You are considered protected (immune) if you:
  - Were born before 1957, or
  - Have already had measles, or
  - Have received **two doses** of measles-containing vaccine (usually given as measles, mumps, rubella (MMR) vaccine), or
  - o Have a blood test showing immunity to measles, or
    - Check with your healthcare provider to see if you or your child has the correct doses for their age.
- If you are protected from measles, you do not have to do anything. **Measles vaccine is** extremely effective at preventing measles.

### IF YOU ARE NOT PROTECTED FROM MEASLES, YOU SHOULD RECEIVE A DOSE OF MMR VACCINE.

- Contact your healthcare provider or pediatrician as soon as possible.
  - You may qualify for post-exposure treatment, which can help prevent measles.
  - Ask them to call the health department.
  - This is especially important for anyone who is under 12 months of age, pregnant, or has a weakened immune system.

Any Philadelphia resident can get a free MMR vaccine in Philadelphia at these City Health Centers, Monday through Friday, from 9am – 1pm. No appointment or insurance required.

- Health Center 3 555 S. 43rd St. | 215-685-7504
- Health Center 4 4400 Haverford Ave. | 215-685-7601
- Health Center 5 Annex 2001 W. Berks St. | 215-685-2933
- Mattie L. Humphrey Health Center (Health Center 9) 131 E. Chelten Ave. | 215-685-5701
- o Strawberry Mansion Health Center 2840 W. Dauphin St. | 215-685-2401
- If you were at the Pennsylvania Hospital Emergency Department on April 6 during the times listed above, you should:
  - Stay at home until Sunday, April 27.
  - Contact your healthcare provider if you develop symptoms.
- If you were at the Holy Redeemer Emergency Department on April 8 during the times listed above, you should:
  - Stay at home until Tuesday, April 29.
  - Contact your healthcare provider if you develop symptoms.
- If you develop any measles-like symptoms (fever, runny nose, cough, puffy eyes, followed by rash), you should:
  - Contact your healthcare provider as soon as possible. Tell them you may have been exposed to measles.
  - Contact the Health Department by calling 215-685-6740, then pressing #5.
  - Make sure your provider knows you were exposed to measles before you go to the office.

#### INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

- If you're traveling internationally, the following groups should receive a vaccine dose at least 2 weeks before travel:
  - Infants who are 6-12 months old (they'll still get the standard 2 doses for kids after they turn 1).
  - Children at least 1 year old who haven't received their second dose.
  - Adults with only one dose and no test results that show they're immune to measles.
