






## Philadelphia Influenza Activity


Please note these data are provisional and subject to change.

During week 29, influenza diagnoses at local emergency departments and positive detections of influenza A at select local hospital laboratories remained low. Detections for influenza B remained low during week 29, consistent with the past several weeks. Data from all facilities are complete from Week 8 2025 forward. Twenty-nine influenza outbreaks in long-term care facilities have been reported and confirmed (≥ 1 case of laboratory confirmed flu reported in a long-term care facility) so far this season.









## Pennsylvania

As of July 19, 2025 the Pennsylvania Department of Health (PADOH) respiratory virus summaries remain paused due to low activity. Activity levels in PA are based on laboratory confirmed influenza cases. ## **United States**

As of July 19, 2025, the CDC reported that influenza activity remains low. In week 29, clinical laboratories reported 142 (0.6%) of 26,022 specimens tested positive for influenza, 65.5% of which were influenza A specimens subtyped at public health labs, 100% have been subtyped as H1N1. In week 29, all jurisdictions with sufficient data reported minimal influenza activity. Activity levels were calculated from outpatient data reported to ILINet.
