


## Philadelphia Influenza Activity


*Please note these data are provisional and subject to change.*

During week 41, influenza diagnoses at local emergency departments remained low. Detections for influenza A and influenza B at select local hospital laboratories remained low during week 41, consistent with the past several weeks. No influenza outbreaks in long-term care facilities have been reported or confirmed ( $\geq 1$  case of laboratory confirmed flu reported in a long-term care facility) during the 2025-2026 season so far.


**Influenza Diagnoses at Philadelphia Emergency Departments, Current Season Compared with Previous Season**




**Laboratory-Based Surveillance for Influenza A Philadelphia, 2020/2021 through 2025/2026 Seasons\***
