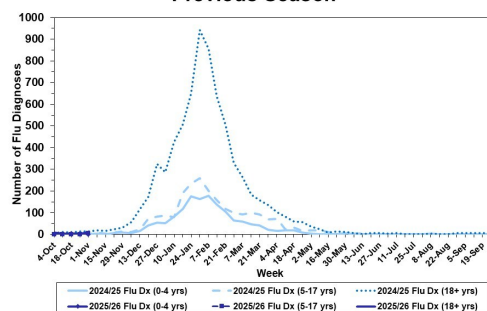


Philadelphia Influenza Activity

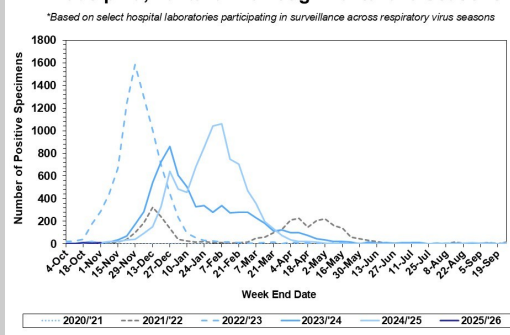
Please note these data are provisional and subject to change.

During week 44, influenza diagnoses at local emergency departments remained low for all ages. Detections for influenza A and influenza B at select local hospital laboratories remained low during week 44, consistent with the past several weeks. No influenza outbreaks in long-term care facilities have been reported or confirmed (≥ 1 case of laboratory confirmed flu reported in a long-term care facility) during the 2025-2026 season to date.

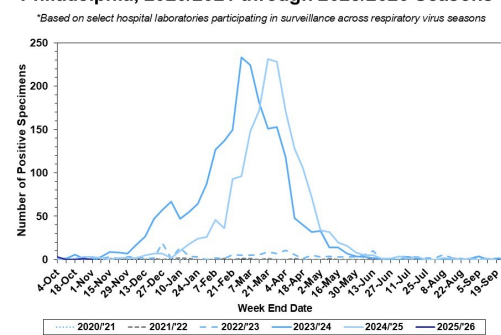
Influenza Diagnoses at Philadelphia Emergency Departments, Current Season Compared with Previous Season



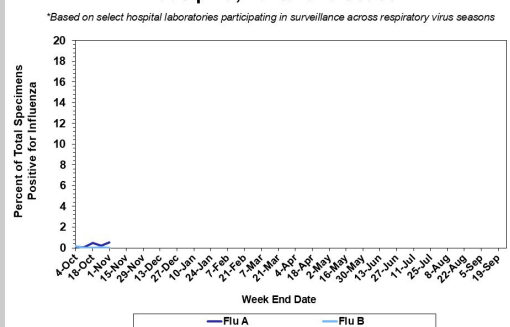
Laboratory-Based Surveillance for Influenza A Philadelphia, 2020/2021 through 2025/2026 Seasons*
