




Philadelphia Department of Public Health Seasonal Influenza Surveillance Report MMWR Week 50 December 7, 2025—December 13, 2025


Philadelphia Influenza Activity


Please note these data are provisional and subject to change.

During week 50, influenza diagnoses at local emergency departments increased for all age groups. Positive detections for influenza A at select local hospital laboratories increased sharply, while detections for influenza B remained low during week 50. Two influenza outbreaks in long-term care facilities have been reported and confirmed (≥ 1 case of laboratory confirmed flu reported in a long-term care facility) during the 2025-2026 season to date.









Pennsylvania

As of December 13, 2025 the Pennsylvania Department of Health (PADOH) respiratory virus summaries currently list influenza activity as low but increasing rapidly. Activity levels in PA are based on laboratory confirmed influenza cases. United States

As of December 13, 2025, the CDC reported that influenza activity is increasing across the country. In week 50, clinical laboratories reported 10,456 (14.8%) of 70,675 specimens tested positive for influenza, 95.4% of which were influenza A specimens subtyped at public health labs, 89.9% have been subtyped as H3N2 and 10.1% have been subtyped as H1N1. In week 50, 29 jurisdictions with sufficient data reported minimal to low levels of activity, including low activity reported in Pennsylvania. Additionally,19 jurisdictions reported moderate to high activity, while 6 jurisdictions, including New York City and New Jersey, reported very high activity during week 50.
